

CENSUS INFORMATION NEEDED

Are you new to the community and have young children? Was your baby born someplace other than Worthington? Do you have new neighbors with young children? We need your help! ECFE funding depends upon having accurate information about the children, ages birth to kindergarten who reside in our school district. Please call our office at 507-727-1225 so we can add the child's name to our census data. Being in the census ensures that you will recieve Early Childhood Family Education mailing, be notified for Early Childhood Screening, and recieve preschool and kindergarten information when your child becomes eligible to attend.



Minnesota State Law requires that children age 3 1/2 - 4 years participate in a developmental early childhood screening. This screening is free. The purpose of the screening is to identify children who may benefit from district and community resources that are available to help in their development.

The screening will consist of the following components: fine/gross motor skills, language development, concepts, height/weight, vision, hearing, review of child's health history, and immunization record (these are not substitutes for comprehensive exams).

District 518 will be sending out letters of invitation to children who are in the appropriate age range. If your child is 4 years of age and has not been screened or if you would like to check if your child is listed on our census, contact Melanie Kuhl, Early Childhood Screening Coordinator at (507) 727-1207 for more information. The Enrichment Programs Coordinator will determine whether any additional information is needed to determine if the child qualifies for this income-based program. 

Students complete their first two years at Minnesota West Community College and then transition to Southwest Minnesota State University where they complete a flexible year-long half-day student teaching model. Funding is available to help cover tuition, books, and expenses related to becoming licensed educators. 




Our students have started the mandated testing components that will remain a focus for many of our teachers and students throughout the next few months. These tests provide important information in understanding where the student's knowledge of reading, math, language skills, and science.

The EDGE (Enrichment Directed towards Gaining and Extending knowledge) after school program for students in grades kindergarten through 8th grade has helped our students work on their math and reading skills. EDGE also helps with social and emotional skill building for students that need that additional guidance. Currently, this year Prairie Elementary (K – gr. 2) has 120 students, the Intermediate School (gr. 3 – 5) has 91 students, and 120 students at WMS. This number might increase after parent teacher conferences, testing, or a student is having frustrations in the classroom as the year progresses. EDGE is offered after school and during summer school for District 518 students.

The availability of credit recovery and night school has been beneficial to many of our high school students from WHS and the Learning Center. We currently have approximately 260 WHS/LC students taking night school at the Learning Center to earn credit recovery towards earning their high school diploma. Our VIBE (Virtual Instruction by Excellence), an online program, currently has 670 students participating in classes from home. These programs will help in working with students to keep them on track in the classroom and towards graduation.



District 518 staff has worked hard this year on many fronts to provide innovative teaching lessons, assignments, and projects for our students. We appreciate their efforts to adapt and be flexible in working on many levels to keep kids learning and doing well in the classroom.




